Remarks.

Between points A and B embankment of rifle-pits is 2 1/2 ft. high, the ditch is 2 1/2 ft. deep, 3 ft. wide, and on the inside of the embankment. On edge of embankment are pine posts 1 to 7 inches in diameter driven into the ground, forming stoccade, 3 ft. high; not strong; the stoccade extends around outside the embankment no guns mounted Dec. 3rd 1863. Between points A. and B.

Between points B and C, the ditch is on outside of embankment, and is 8 ft. wide and from 4 to 5 ft. deep embankment some 3 1/2 ft. high, no berm between edge of embankment and foot of ditch; line of abatis some 10 ft. outside of ditch.

The Foundry works at this place are next in capacity to the Tredegar works at Richmond. Cannon are cast and finished; Shot shell and other munitions are manufactured in large quantities, and shipped to Atlanta, Mobile, and other points.

The Rolling Mills are intended for manufacturing R. H. iron, armor plates, &c. At the Navy Yard is being built a Steamer 270 ft. long 45 ft. wide, to be double plated with plates 2 inch thick, to be finished in February.

At the Arsenal are manufactured arms and munitions of all kinds for shipment.

Extensive repair shops are connected with the Arsenal. large quantity of powder in Magazine.

At Saddle and Harness Shops are manufactured Saddles, Harness, Knapsacks, Haversacks, Canteens, &c.

At Wagon shops are manufactured 18 Wagons per week.

There are also several Foundries used by Govt, owned by citizens. Large quantities of commissary and Quartermaster Stores are received, stored, and shipped.

There are from 6000 to 7000 bales of cotton in store.

Employed in the works are some 800 mechanics and detailed men and a large number of Blacks. Military strength of Post one company of Boys and exempts doing Provost duty, 100 County Militia, (men over 15 years of age liable to do duty never been drilled or seen service), and the Mechanics & detailed men above mentioned, who are liable to serve in times of danger. Total, 1000 men. There are no forces other than Militia nearer than Atlanta or Enterprise. Dec. 3rd 1863 there were eight 8 pounders mounted as shown on the map.
